- Scontinued our longstanding partnership with the Boston Public Schools focused on history fieldtrips for students, teacher training, and curriculum sources for teachers with our colleagues at the Bostonian Society, Old South Meeting House, Old North Church, Museum of African American History, USS Constitution Museum, and National Parks of Boston.
- \* Organized 32 special living history programs sharing the art of traditional crafts, 18th-century characters, and concerts of colonial music.
- \* Provided resources, historical interpretation, and curatorial advice to over 100 authors, students, collectors, genealogists, and interested citizens.
- Reached out to the North End community with free programs for the North End Branch of the Public Library, St. John's and the Elliot Schools, participation in neighborhood events such as National Night Out and Neighborhood Block Party, and North End Family Pride Night, and active assistance with historical issues related to the redesign of North Square and proposed public art elements.
