Staged a full slate of living history performances, concerts, and colonial craft demonstrations after a two-year hiatus.



Created a Diversity, Equity, Access and Inclusion Framework for Action to guide our efforts to be fully accessible to all, sustain a welcoming and diverse workplace, and encourage diverse candidates to pursue work in the museum and history field.



Celebrated the completion of an intensive, collaborative climate action planning process with the Boston Green Ribbon Commission and eight other cultural organizations. This work is already helping us identify potential risks to our properties so that we can begin to put measures in place to mitigate impact.



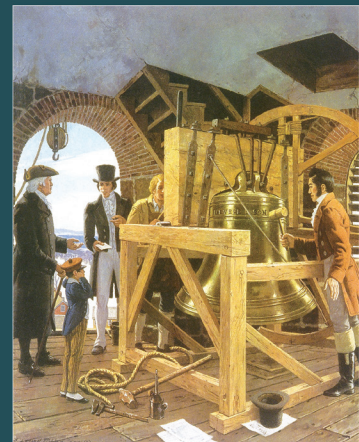

Established a working list of capital projects and programs to inform our fundraising and planning around the upcoming commemoration of the 250th anniversary of the American Revolution.



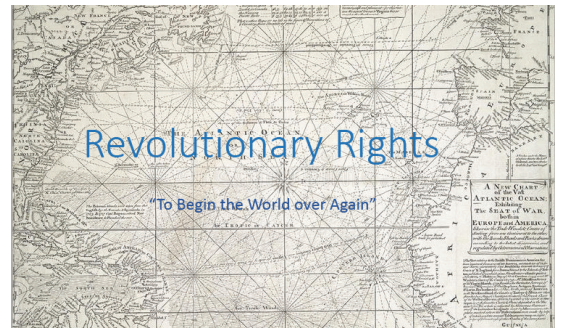
