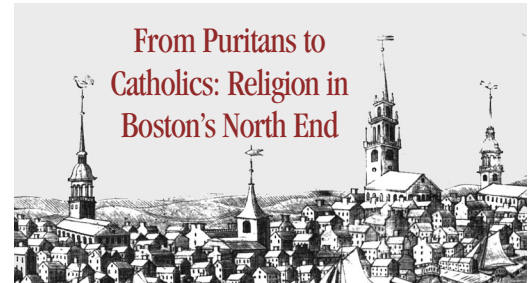
Worked closely with local teachers as the lead on our annual Trails to Freedom Summer Teacher Workshop and through participation in both the Boston Public Schools New Teacher Development Resource Fair and the Investigating History Summer Institute for 5th, 6th, and 7th Grade teachers.



Collaborated with Suffolk University and several other historic sites on the first-ever two-week Summer Public History Institute for high school students, designed to provide budding social historians with a deep dive into the rich history of Boston’s Colonial, Revolutionary, and modern eras.



Finalized new text panels and launched an updated Interpretive Plan for the Paul Revere House to help further public understanding of the relevance of the legacy of Paul Revere and his iconic home, while also elevating the names and stories of less well-known residents.



Held a popular and well-received Lowell Lecture Series entitled: “From Puritans to Catholics: Religion in the North End” in collaboration with Suffolk University, GBH, the North End Historical Society, and Old North Illuminated.

Supported staff professional development with our “Learn and Earn” program, which included attending our lecture series and joining a fabulous field trip to the Massachusetts Grand Lodge of Masons.



Participated in key neighborhood events, including the North End Pride Celebration and North End Neighborhood Night Out.



Installed LED track lighting in the Revere House that is less obtrusive, more responsive to changing ambient light levels, more energy- and cost-efficient, and safer.



Contributed a session on our efforts to make our historic site fully accessible at the Kennedy Center for the Performing Arts Leadership Exchange in Arts and Disability Conference held in Boston.



Continued to value our collaboration with North Bennet Street School, which includes special tours for students and the hiring of NBSS preservation carpentry student Thomas Carbeck to complete a number of small projects.



Completed a much-needed and long overdue repointing of the Hichborn House chimneys and sections of the north-facing exterior wall.



Engaged landscape architects from Brown, Richardson + Rowe to redesign the courtyard that serves the Hichborn House as the final step in making all our outdoor spaces fully accessible and welcoming, while also addressing drainage issues.
