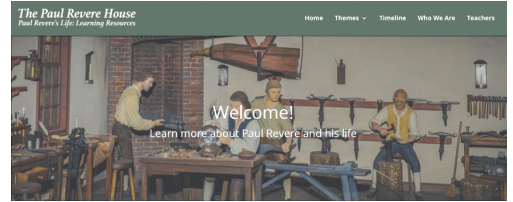


2024 Accomplishments & Initiatives

Launched *Paul Revere's Life: A Learning Resource*, our new interactive web-based tool that commemorates the 250th anniversary of the American Revolution by providing educational materials for use in classrooms across the Nation. Teachers, students, and learners of all ages will find primary sources, key objects, and timelines that illuminate Paul Revere's life and the Revolution.



Participated in the Heritage Festival at Paul Revere Heritage Site, the location of his copper mill operation on the Neponset River in Canton, MA.



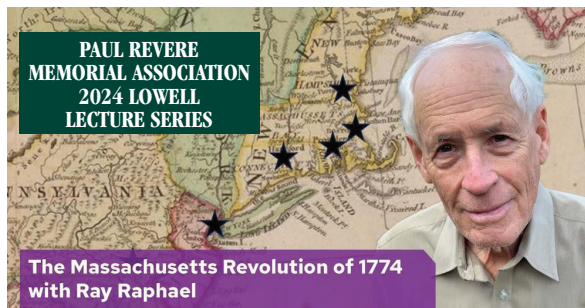
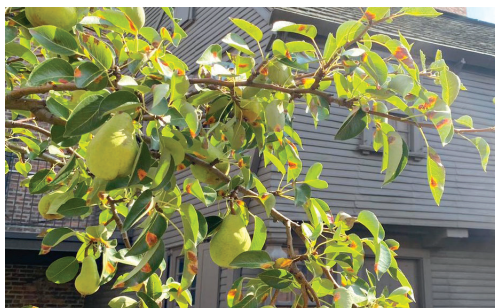
Joined with our North End neighbors to create the North End Historical and Cultural Alliance to use our collective voice to enhance our impact and promote our programs.



Hosted a popup Solar Eclipse viewing in April as well as a reenlistment ceremony for a sailor on the naval destroyer USS *Oscar Austin* during Fleet Week in July as part of our ongoing efforts to serve as a valued community resource.



Devised a series of programs to commemorate Revere's many rides as the essential Patriot courier 250 years ago in 1774. Activities included innovative partnerships with the Fraunces Tavern Museum in New York, Carpenters' Hall in Philadelphia, Suffolk Resolves House/Milton Historical Society, and the Portsmouth Athenaeum in Portsmouth NH. A key component of this was our Lowell Lecture Series "Paul Revere's Other Rides: Perspectives on His Patriot Messenger Missions," with its focus on this lesser known aspect of Revere's patriotic exploits.

Continued to value our collaboration with North Bennet Street School, which includes working with the NBSS preservation carpentry program on a number of projects as well as special tours for students.



Reinstated our research fellowship by hiring Ryan Bachman, PhD, a recent graduate of the University of Delaware, to explore the stories of Black residents of the North End from 1780-1810.



Facilitated and participated in the annual Trails to Freedom Summer Teacher Workshop and collaborated with Suffolk University on their two-week Summer Public History Institute for high school students.



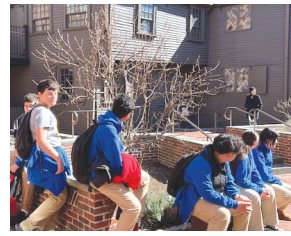

Honored to receive a Massachusetts History Alliance Star Award for our dedication to public history.



Continued to plan and design essential capital improvements as part of our 250th commemoration of the Revolution including upgrades to our ticket booth and entrance, redesign of the Hichborn House courtyard, masonry repairs to the Paul Revere House main chimney, improvements to our bell shelter, and restoration of the Revere House casement windows.
